THE MOTOR VEHICLES (DIRECTION  
INDICATOR AND STOP LIGHT)  
REGULATIONS (NORTHERN  
IRELAND), 1936.

Notice is hereby given that the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland has

made Regulations, dated the 4th day of June, 1936, under the powers conferred on the Ministry by the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, and the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act (N.I.), 1934, prescribing the requirements in respect of direction indicators and stop lights fitted to motor vehicles registered for the first time under the Roads Act, 1920, on or after the first day of August, 1936.
