CORONATION OF HIS MAJESTY. COURT OF CLAIMS.

REVOCATION OF MODIFICATION
DATED 24th OCTOBER, 1935, OF OPEN
GENERAL EXPORT LICENCES NOS.
G.L. 110, G.L. 111 & G.L. 112.

The modification, dated 24th October, 1935, providing that the three Open General Export Licences numbered G.L.110, G. L.111 and G.L.112, issued by the Board of Trade on the 1st June, 1931, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1931, shall not apply to the exportation of any of the articles mentioned therein from any port in Great Britain or Northern Ireland to the Kingdom of Italy or the colonies and dependencies thereof, or any territory in the effective military occupation thereof, is hereby revoked with effect from 15th July, 1936,
