OIL IN NAVIGABLE WATERS ACT, 1922.

The Oil in Navigable Waters (Records) Order, 1923, made by the Board of Trade under Section 3 of the Oil in Navigable Waters Act, 1922 (12 and 13 Geo. V. c. 39).

WHEREAS Section 3 of the Oil in Navigable Waters Act, 1922, provides that there shall be kept in the case of every vessel as defined in the said Act a record, in such form as the Board of Trade may prescribe, of all operations in connection with the transfer of oil to and from the vessel:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the said Section 3 and of all other powers enabling them on that behalf, do hereby prescribe as follows:—

(1) The record to be kept under the said Act shall be in such form as to show clearly the following particulars:—

- (i) The name and port of registry of the vessel or barge;
- (ii) The date and time of transfer;
- (iii) The place of transfer;
- (iv) The amount and description of oil transferred;
- (v) From what vessel, barge or premises on land, and to what vessel, barge or premises, the oil was transferred.

(2) The record of each operation shall be separately signed and dated by the master or

person responsible as provided by Section 3 (2) of the said Act.

(3) The record may be kept in the Official Log of a vessel, in which case the name and port of registry of the vessel need not be stated separately.

(4) This Order may be cited as the Oil in Navigable Waters (Records) Order, 1923.

NOTE.—The Act comes into operation on the 1st January, 1923, and applies to any vessel which is capable of carrying in bulk, whether for cargo or for bunker purposes more than twenty-five tons of oil, or which, though not so capable, is constructed or fitted to carry in bulk as aforesaid more than five tons of oil in any one space or container.

The provisions of Section 3 (2) of the Act are as follows:—

“The record required to be kept under this Section shall, in the case of a barge, be kept, so far as relates to the transfer of oil to the barge by the person supplying the oil, and, so far as relates to the transfer of oil from the barge, by the person to whom the oil is delivered, and shall, in every other case, be kept by the master of the vessel.”

DANGEROUS DRUGS.

Order, dated 29th December, 1922, made by the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland under the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920 (10 and 11 Geo. 5, c. 46), The Government of Ireland Act, 1920 (10 and 11 Geo. 5, c. 67), and the Orders made thereunder, revoking as from 1st January, 1923, the Authority granted to certain persons not Registered under The Dentists Act, 1878, to purchase preparations containing not more than one per cent. of Cocaine for use as local anaesthetics in Dentistry.

In pursuance of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the Orders made thereunder, I hereby revoke as from the 1st January, 1923, the authority, dated the 13th August, 1921, granted by the Secretary of State to persons who are bona fide engaged in Dentistry and were so engaged on the 28th July, 1916, but are not registered under the Dentists Act, 1878, to purchase preparations containing not more than one per cent. of cocaine for use as local anaesthetics in Dentistry.

ORDER.

CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACT AND (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922.

I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, being the Civil Authority under the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the said Act and the Regulations made thereunder, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby Order and require that every person within the County of the City of Belfast shall remain within doors between the hours of 11.30 o'clock p.m. and 5 o'clock a.m. unless provided with a Permit in writing from the Commissioner of Police for the City of Belfast, or some person duly authorised by him.

Provided that any Permit granted under this Order may be revoked at any time by the person authorised to issue the same, who shall in every such case send notice in writing to the person to whom the Permit was granted of its having been revoked.

This Order shall come into force at 11.30 o'clock p.m. on the 7th day of January, 1923.

This Order varies the Order made by me on the 8th day of June, 1922, in so far as that Order prescribed the hours between which persons should remain within doors within the County of the City of Belfast, but not otherwise; and this Order Cancels the Order made by me on the 23rd day of September, 1922.

NOTES.

1. The Order of the 8th June, 1922, imposed Curfew from 11 p.m. to 6 a.m., and the Order of the 23rd September, 1922, imposed Curfew from 11.30 p.m. to 6 a.m., within the County of the City of Belfast.

2. Under this Order and the Regulations above specified every person who is in the area to which this Order applies during Curfew hours must during those hours either remain in his usual place of abode, or at a hotel or registered lodging house where he is duly registered. If he intends to stay elsewhere during Curfew hours he must give previous notice to the police at the Police Station nearest to the house where he intends to stay of his intention to stay therein.

3. Inmates of, or persons engaged at schools, hospitals, or other charitable or religious institutions during Curfew hours may remain therein during these hours.

This Order will not affect persons conveying to a hospital a person requiring treatment thereat.

5. Existing Permits granted by or under the authority of the Commissioner of Police for the City of Belfast, so long as they are in force, hold good for the periods covered by them. It has been decided by the Military Authorities that Permits granted by them to members of the civil population shall now be withdrawn, and such Permits will cease to be in force after the 20th January, 1923. Any person holding such a Permit should before that date apply for a Police Permit as directed in note 6 below.

6. Applications for permits should be made by post to the Commissioner of Police for the City of Belfast.
