TRADE BOARDS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.
RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND).

The Trade Board established by the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland under powers conferred by the Trade

Boards Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, for the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade in Northern Ireland as defined in the Schedule to the Trade Boards (Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade, Northern Ireland) (Constitution, Proceedings and Meetings) Regulations, 1924, dated 16th September, 1924, hereby give notice that they propose to vary general minimum time-rates, piece-work basis time-rates, general minimum piece-rates and general overtime rates for certain male and female workers.

On request to the Trade Board particulars of the proposed variation of minimum rates will be given if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to their proposals which may be lodged with them within fourteen days from the 7th day of May, 1937. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Northern Ireland), Office of Trade Board, Stormont, Belfast. It is desirable that persons making objections should state, as far as possible, the precise grounds therefor.
