# TRADE BOARDS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.

### READYMADE AND WHOLESALE BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND).

The Trade Board established by the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland under powers conferred by the Trade Boards Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, for the Readymade and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade in Northern Ireland as defined in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Wholesale Bespoke (Readymade and Tailoring Trade, Northern Ireland) (Conand stitution, Proceedings Meetings) Regulations, 1925, dated the 9th April, 1925, hereby give notice that they propose to vary general minimum time-rates piecework basis time-rates and general overtime rates for certain male and female workers and to cancel general minimum time-rates and general overtime rates for male learners in the said trade.

On request to the Trade Board particulars of the proposed variation and cancellation of minimum rates will be given if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to their proposals, which may be lodged with them within fourteen days from the twenty-second day of June, 1937. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Readymade and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Northern Ireland), Office of Trade Board, Stormont, Belfast. It is desirable that persons making objections should state, as far as possible, the precise grounds therefor.

The Civil Service Commissioners for Northern Ireland hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, and, in so far as they apply to appointments in the County Court Service, with the concurrence of the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland.

### REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF CLERK (MALE) IN THE CIVIL SERVICE.

1. The limits of age are 18 and 20. If a competition begins in one of the first six months of any year, candidates must be of or over the age of 18 and under the age of 20 on the 31st day of March in that year. If a competition begins in one of the last six months of the year, candidates must be of or over the age of 18 and under the age of 20 on the 30th day of September in that year. In reckoning the age for this purpose candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

2. Every candidate must be a naturalborn British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's Dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the Ministry of Finance has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. A fee of £1 will be required from each candidate applying to enter the competition.
