DETERMINATION OF PIG INDUSTRY  
COUNCIL FOR NORTHERN IRELAND.

The Pig Industry Council for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Council"), in exercise of their powers under Section Five of the Agricultural Marketing (Pig Industry) Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, hereby determine as follows:—

I. As and from the 1st day of July, 1937, the Determination of the Council, made with the approval of the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland on the 29th day of January, 1937, and amended

with the approval of the said Ministry on the 30th day of March, 1937, and 27th day of May, 1937, shall be amended by the deletion therefrom of Paragraph 9 of Part

II (Terms of Sale).

II. Notwithstanding anything contained in the said Determination, for the month of July, 1937, pigs sold by a producer shall be sold at the following prices:—

To the Parish Priest for the time being in charge of Aghaginduff Chapel, a certain promissory note and any balance due thereon, the yearly instalments payable thereunder to be expended in the first place for prayers (and in addition to the Masses provided for), to be offered once every year for the repose of the souls of those already mentioned and Testator's other relatives, and secondly, for general repairs to said Chapel and in addition to the bequest of £30.

And Probate of said Will and three Codicils was on the 7th day of May, 1937, granted forth of the Principal Registry of the King's Bench Division (Probate) of the High Court of Justice in Northern Ireland to Edward Holland and John McBride, both of Aghaginduff, Cabra, Dungannon, Co. Tyrone, farmers, the Executors named in said Will.
