AGRICULTURAL MARKETING (PIG INDUSTRY) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934.

DETERMINATION OF PIG INDUSTRY COUNCIL FOR NORTHERN IRELAND.

The Pig Industry Council for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Council"), in exercise of their powers under Section Five of the Agricultural Marketing (Pig Industry) Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, hereby determine as follows:-

I. As and from the 1st day of July, 1937, the Determination of the Council, made with the approval of the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland on the 29th day of January, 1937, and amended

with the approval of the said Ministry on the 30th day of March, 1937, and 27th day of May, 1937, shall be amended by the deletion therefrom of Paragraph 9 of Part

II (Terms of Sale).

II. Notwithstanding anything contained in the said Determination, for the month of July, 1937, pigs sold by a producer shall be sold at the following prices :--
