that the receipt of the Treasurer for the time being or other proper officer of the said Education Board of Strabane Presbytery, or of the said missions and charitable organisations, for the amount of the legacy bequeathed to the said Education Board of such missions or charitable institutions would be a good and sufficient discharge to her Executor and Trustee for the amounts of the respective legacies bequeathed to such Education Board, missions, or charitable organisations respectively.

And the Testatrix further declared that the share of the residue of her residuary estate going to the Sustentation Fund of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland should not be subject to the operation of the Tenth Fund, but invested as capital monies, and the income only applied annually to the said Sustentation Fund.
