shall have made any such Order, a prison or prisons shall be named in such Order to which prisoners who, but for such Order, would have been confined in the prison or bridewell so wholly closed, shall be removed or committed and in which they shall be kept in custody:

And whereas there are no prisoners who, but for this Order, would have been confined in the bridewell hereinafter ordered to be closed, and it is unnecessary to make provision for the removal or committal of any such prisoners:

And whereas by virtue of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the several Orders made thereunder and the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, all the powers of the Lord Lieutenant under the said Section 30 of the Prisons (Ireland) Act, 1877, in their application to Northern Ireland are now vested in Us as Governor of Northern Ireland:

Now we, the Governor of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers vested in Us under and by virtue of the said recited Acts and Orders and of all powers enabling Us in this behalf do hereby Order and Direct that the Bridewell at Newry in the County of Down shall be closed, discontinued and no longer used as a bridewell or prison, of which all persons concerned are desired to take notice.

THE COLORADO BEETLE (NORTHERN
IRELAND) ORDER OF 1923.

(Dated 6th February, 1923).

(D.I.P.5)

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Destructive Insects and

Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, orders, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

COMMENCEMENT.

1. This Order shall come into operation on the Sixth day of February, Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-three.

RESTRICTION ON IMPORTATION OF
VEGETABLES AND PLANTS FROM
FRANCE.

2. (1) For the prevention of the introduction of the Colorado Beetle (*Leptinotarsa decemlineata*, Say) the landing in Northern Ireland of any living plants or vegetables shipped from any port in European France, whether consigned by direct shipment to ports in Northern Ireland or via Great Britain, is hereby prohibited unless the landing thereof is authorised by a licence issued by the Ministry or by an Inspector or other authorised officer, or the plants or vegetables are accompanied by a declaration purporting to be made by the grower or exporter thereof in the form prescribed in the Schedule to this Order. Such declaration shall be delivered to an officer of Customs at the same time and together with the entry relating to the consignment.

2. Living plants or vegetables shipped from any port in European France and landed in Northern Ireland without such a licence or declaration as is prescribed in this Order shall be forthwith destroyed by and at the expense of the importer unless the plants or vegetables are authorised to be disposed of otherwise by a licence issued by the Ministry or by an Inspector or other authorised officer, and any person failing to comply with the provisions of this Article as to destruction or with the conditions (if any) imposed by such licence shall on summary conviction be liable to a penalty of ten pounds.

(3) In this Article the expression "living plants or vegetables" means trees and shrubs, tubers, bulbs and flower roots, raw vegetables, including potatoes, potato haulms and leaves, and tomatoes; "Ministry" means the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland; "Inspector" means an Inspector of the Ministry; and "Authorised Officer" means any person authorised by the Ministry.

(4) The restrictions hereby imposed shall not affect the requirements of the Destructive Insects and Pests (Northern Ireland), Order of 1922.

SHORT TITLE.

3. This Order may be cited as the Colorado Beetle (Northern Ireland) Order of 1923.
