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### ROAD AND RAILWAY TRANSPORT ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1935.

Order made by the Minister of Home Affairs under Section 14 of the Road and Railway Transport Act (Northern Ireland), 1935, extending the period within which the scheme for Pooling Receipts of the Northern Ireland Road Transport Board and the Railway Companies may be prepared.

I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Bart., D.L., M.P., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by Section 14 of the Road and Railway

Transport Act (Northern Ireland), 1935, (in this Order referred to as "the Act") and of all other powers in that behalf enabling me, but without prejudice to any further exercise of such powers, hereby Order and Direct that the period within which the Joint Committee established under the aforesaid section shall prepare and submit to the Northern Ireland Road Transport Board and to each of the Railway Companies mentioned in said section the pooling scheme framed in accordance with the provisions of the First Schedule to the Act shall be further extended to the fifteenth day of January, 1938:

This order shall have effect as and from the fifteenth day of July, 1937.

### SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES ACT, 1921.

AMENDMENT OF LISTS OF ARTICLES CHARGE-  
ABLE WITH DUTY UNDER PART I

AND

ADDITIONAL LIST OF ARTICLES CHARGEABLE  
WITH SUCH DUTY

*(Safeguarding of Key Industries).*

1. Section 1 (5) of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, provides that for the

purpose of preventing disputes arising as to whether any goods are or are not chargeable with duty under Part I of the Act, the Board of Trade may from time to time issue lists defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under any of the general descriptions set out in the Schedule to the Act, and where any list is so issued defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under such general description, the said Schedule shall have effect as if the articles comprised in the list were therein substituted for that general description.

2. Section 5 (3) of the Finance Act, 1936, provides amongst other things that the power of the Board of Trade under Sub-section 5 of Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, to issue lists defining articles which are to be taken as falling under any of the general descriptions set out in the Schedule to that Act shall include power to amend any list so issued.

3. The Board of Trade hereby amend List H issued in 1921 and List H (ii) issued in 1926, by deleting certain trade names, by inserting certain chemical names to replace such deleted trade names as had no equivalent in these Lists, by deleting in List H certain chemical names, and the indication of the chemicals which fall within the scope of the Dyestuffs (Import Regulation) Act, 1920, and by sub-dividing certain of the general chemical headings in List H (ii). Such amendments are more particularly set forth in the First Schedule hereto and shall take effect from the 19th day of August, 1937.

4. The Board of Trade have prepared the additional List which is set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, and which is to be regarded as further defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under the following general description in the schedule to the Act, viz. :—

Synthetic organic chemicals (other than synthetic organic dyestuffs, colours and colouring matters imported for use as such, and organic intermediate products imported for their manufacture) analytical reagents, all other fine chemicals (except sulphate of quinine of vegetable origin) and chemicals manufactured by fermentation processes.

5. Articles included in the said additional List will, subject to the provisions of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, be chargeable with duty under Part I of the Act as amended, on and after the 19th August, 1937.

PROHIBITION UNDER SECTION 5 OF THE CUSTOMS AND INLAND REVENUE ACT, 1888, OF THE USE IN BEER OF CERTAIN SUBSTANCES.

WHEREAS it appears to the satisfaction of the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury that glycyrrhizic acid, ammonium glycyrrhizate and all other salts of glycyrrhizic acid, and preparations or mixtures containing any of the above mentioned substances, are capable of being used in the manufacture or preparation for sale of Beer and that the use of any of the said substances is calculated to affect prejudicially the interests of the Revenue.

Now the said Lords Commissioners, under the power conferred upon them by Section 5 of The Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1888, do hereby prohibit the use of any of the said substances in the manufacture or preparation for sale of Beer.
