THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT  
MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS His late Majesty King George the Fifth, being satisfied that the Law of the Province of Alberta as respects duties leviable in respect of property situate in Northern Ireland when passing on death was to the like effect as the provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, was pleased by an Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of May, 1933, to apply Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, as in force in Northern Ireland, to the Province of Alberta, as respects duties leviable as aforesaid

AND WHEREAS by the said Section, as in force in Northern Ireland, it is, amongst other things, enacted that His Majesty in Council may revoke any Order issued under the said Section applying its provisions to any British Possession as respects duties leviable as aforesaid when it appears that the Law of such British Possession has been so altered that it would not authorise the making of such an Order:

AND WHEREAS the Law of the Province of Alberta has been so altered as aforesaid and it is expedient to revoke the said Order in Council:

NOW THEREFORE His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in Him by section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, as

it applies in Northern Ireland under the provisions of Article 14 of the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of the Taxing Acts) Order, 1922, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The provisions of the Order of the 25th day of May, 1933, which apply Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, as in force in Northern Ireland, to the Province of Alberta, as respects the aforesaid duties are hereby revoked.

2. This Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 19th day of May, 1937.
