The following Letter Patent was signed by His Majesty The King on 12 June 2024 in respect of the Post Office (Horizon System) Offences (Scotland) Bill ASP 6.

CHARLES THE THIRD by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of Our other Realms and Territories King Head of the Commonwealth Defender of the Faith To Our trusty and well beloved the members of the Scottish Parliament GREETING:

FORASMUCH as a Bill has been passed by the Scottish Parliament and has been submitted to Us for Our Royal Assent by the Presiding Officer of the Scottish Parliament in accordance with the Scotland Act 1998 the short Title of which Bill is set forth in the Schedule hereto but that Bill by virtue of the Scotland Act 1998 does not become an Act of the Scottish Parliament nor have effect in the Law without Our Royal Assent signified by Letters Patent under Our Scottish Seal (that is Our Seal appointed by the Treaty of Union to be kept and used in Scotland in place of the Great Seal of Scotland) signed with Our own hand and recorded in the Register of the Great Seal We have therefore caused these Our Letters Patent to be made and have signed them and by them do give Our Royal Assent to that Bill COMMANDING ALSO the Keeper of Our Scottish Seal to seal these Our Letters with that Seal.

WAITING RESTRICTIONS - ROYAL HILLSBOROUGH

The Department for the Economy has made a Statutory Rule entitled "The Further Education (Student Support) (Eligibility) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2024" (S.R. 2024 No. 128 which will come into operation on 01 August 2024.

These Regulations make relevant amendments to the Further Education (Student Support) (Eligibility) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2012 to implement the change of residency requirements for certain groups and enact the addition of three new residency categories of persons eligible for student support without being required to be ordinarily resident in the UK, the EEA or Switzerland for the three years immediately prior to the start of their course. It will also make minor amendments to the legislation to remove remaining redundant references to the grace period, and to insert the definition of eligible student into the interpretation section of the legislation and will include savings provisions so that family members of persons granted leave under one of the Afghan Schemes who have already qualified for support under The Further Education (Student Support) (Eligibility) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2012, can continue to qualify for support on that basis.

It also provides that specified performance-based fees will fall outside of the regulatory charge cap calculation.
