The Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs has made a Statutory Rule entitled "The Bovine Genetics Genotyping Scheme Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2026", (S.R. 2026 No. 14) which comes into operation on 1st September 2026.

The Rule gives legal effect to "Bovine Genetics Genotyping Scheme Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2026".

The SR specifies the eligibility requirements for animals and farm businesses including eligible bovine breeds for the scheme, specifies procedures for inadequate samples and tampering, Use of NIFAIS information and payment rates. It also amends existing (EU) Regulation 2013/1306 to ensure the rules on farm sustainability apply in relation to requirements about bovine genetics from 1 January 2028.
