And whereas by Article 14 of the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of the Taxing Acts) Order, 1922, it is provided that the reference to the United Kingdom in the said section twenty of the Finance Act, 1894, shall, in the application of the provisions of that section to Northern Ireland, be construed as a reference to Northern Ireland:

And whereas on the 2nd day of February, 1895, Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council was pleased to extend section twenty of the Finance Act, 1894, to British India:

And whereas on the 1st day of April, 1937, Burma ceased to be part of India:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that by the law of British Burma no duty is

leviable in respect of property situate in Northern Ireland when passing on death:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the enactments and Order aforesaid, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that section twenty of the Finance Act, 1894, as in force in Northern Ireland, shall apply, as respects duties payable in Northern Ireland in respect of property when passing on death, to British Burma as from the first day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-seven.

Where the eggs were delivered by the vendor to premises used by a licensed wholesale dealer of Class A for the testing, grading, and packing of eggs, or to a collecting depot specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order, an additional three-farthings shall be paid for each complete dozen so delivered.

This Order provides that no person shall during the months of June and July in any year, land in the United Kingdom any sea-fish other than lobsters, crabs, shrimps, prawns, oysters, mussels, cockles and any other kind of shell-fish, which have been caught in waters situate

- (a) to the northward of a line drawn along the parallel of latitude 71° 10' 10" north from the east coast of Greenland to the North Cape of Norway and to the westward of the meridian of the North Cape of Norway (longitude 25° 47' 20" east); or
- (b) to the northward of the parallel of latitude 64° north and to the eastward of the meridian of the North Cape of Norway (longitude 25° 47' 20" east).

This Order came into force on the 28th July, 1938.
