Provided that a hairdressers' shop which is closed for the weekly half-holiday on Saturdays shall be closed for serving customers on Thursdays at 8 o'clock p.m. The provisions of this Order shall not apply to the six days immediately preceding Easter Sunday, the six days immediately preceding the Twelfth July, or the twelve days immediately preceding the 25th December (Christmas Day) in any year.
