A PROCLAMATION

Withdrawing the Proclamations of the 28th day of September, 1938, calling out Officers of the Retired and Emergency Lists of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines and the Special Reserve of Engineer Officers of the Royal Navy, Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve, and Men of the Royal Naval Reserve and the Royal Fleet Reserve and Officers and Men of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, and extending the Term of Service of Seamen serving in the Royal Navy and of Marines serving in the Royal Marine Forces.

Whereas by Our Proclamations of the Twenty-eighth day of September, 1938, We ordered and directed that Officers of the Retired and Emergency Lists of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines, and the Special Reserve of Engineer Officers of the Royal Navy should hold themselves in readiness for actual service, and that Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve and Volunteers under the Royal Naval Reserve (Volunteer) Act, 1859, the Royal Naval Reserve Volunteer Act, 1896, the Naval Reserve Act, 1900, and the Naval Forces Act, 1903, should be called out for or into actual service:

And whereas the state of Public Affairs now admits of the withdrawal of Our said Proclamations:

We do hereby withdraw Our said Proclamations and do release all the said

Officers and Volunteers from actual service thereunder.

And whereas by Our further Proclamation of the said Twenty-eighth day of September, 1938, we ordered and directed that every seaman and marine who was then serving in the Royal Navy or in the Royal Marine Forces, being a seaman whose term of service, or a marine whose first or second term of limited service, had expired or might expire while that Proclamation should continue in force should be required to serve for a period of five years from the expiration of his said term of service, if his services were so long required.

We do also further hereby withdraw Our said Proclamation and do release from further service all men affected thereby.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this Twenty-fifth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, and in the Second year of Our Reign.

MARKETING OF EGGS (DETERMINATION OF WHOLESALE DEALERS' PRICES) (No. 47) ORDER (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1938.

- (a) (i) For hen eggs purchased from a producer, $1\frac{1}{2}$ d. per lb.

Where the eggs were delivered by the vendor to premises used by a licensed wholesale dealer of Class A for the testing, grading, and packing of eggs, or to a collecting depot specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order, an additional halfpenny per lb. shall be paid.

- (ii) For hen eggs purchased by a licensed wholesale dealer of Class A from a licensed wholesale dealer of Class B, $1\frac{1}{2}$ 15-16d. per lb.
Deductions:—Seconds $\frac{1}{2}$ d per egg;
Rejects $1\frac{1}{2}$ d. per egg.

- (b) For duck eggs purchased from a producer $1\frac{1}{5}$ d. per dozen.

Where the eggs were delivered by the vendor to premises used by a licensed wholesale dealer of Class A for the testing, grading, and packing of eggs, or to a collecting depot specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order, an additional three-farthings shall be paid for each complete dozen so delivered.

Deductions:—Rejects $1\frac{1}{2}$ d. per egg.

**MODIFICATION OF OPEN GENERAL
EXPORT LICENCE No. G. L. 168.**

Whereas by the Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1931, the export of certain goods, including *inter alia* aircraft and aircraft engines, is prohibited except under a licence of the Board of Trade;

And whereas the Open General Export Licence No. G. L. 168, issued by the Board of Trade on the 14th July, 1937, permits the exportation of certain aircraft and aircraft engines from any port in Great Britain or Northern Ireland (including any aerodrome approved by the Secretary of State as a Customs aerodrome under Schedule VIII of the Air Navigation (Consolidation Order, 1923) to all destinations other than Ethiopia, Spain, Spanish possessions, or the Spanish Zone of Morocco;

And whereas it is desirable that the said Open General Export Licence should hereafter apply to all destinations in Italian East Africa;

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in the exercise of all powers enabling them in that behalf, do hereby direct and declare that the scope of the said Open General Export Licence No. G.L. 168 is extended, with effect from the date hereof, so as to permit the export of aircraft and aircraft engines to which the said Licence applies to all destinations other than Spain, Spanish possessions, or the Spanish Zone of Morocco.
