CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922 AND 1933.

Whereas by Regulation 26 of the Regulations contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts (Northern Ireland), 1922 and 1933, it is provided that the Civil Authority may by notice prohibit the circulation of any newspaper for any specified period, and that any person circulating or distributing such newspaper within such specified period shall be guilty of an offence against the Regulations in the said Schedule :

Now I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Bart., D.L., M.P., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, being the Civil Authority under the said Act, do hereby in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 26 of the Regulations made under the authority of the above-mentioned Acts, prohibit the circulation of the following newspapers entitled :—

- "An Problacht" or "The Republic" or "The Loyalist" or "The Republican Press."
- "The Irish World and American Industrial Liberator."
- "Fianna."
- "Republican Congress."
- "An Siol" or "The Seed" and
- "Wolfe Tone Weekly Saiorse Na H'Eireann" or "Irish Freedom"

or under any other title or alias whatever in

Northern Ireland from the 1st day of January, 1939, until the 31st day of December, 1939.

MARKETING OF EGGS (DETERMINA-TION OF WHOLESALE DEALERS' PRICES) (No. 50) ORDER (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1938.

Notice is hereby given that an Order has been made by the Ministry of Agriculture determining that the prices payable by licensed wholesale dealers for eggs delivered during the week ended Saturday, 17th December, 1938, shall be as follows:—

(a) (i) For hen eggs purchased from a producer, 11d. per lb.

Where the eggs were delivered by the vendor to premises used by a licensed wholesale dealer of Class A for the testing, grading, and packing of eggs, or to a collecting depot specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order, an additional halfpenny per lb. shall be paid.

 (ii) For hen eggs purchased by a licensed wholesale dealer of Class A from a licensed wholesale dealer of Class B, 11/7-16d. per lb.

Deductions:—Seconds ½d per egg; Rejects 1¹d. per egg.

(b) For duck eggs purchased from a producer 1/5d. per dozen. Where the eggs were delivered by the vendor to premises used by a licensed wholesale dealer of Class A for the testing, grading, and packing of eggs, or to a collecting depot specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order, an additional three-farthings shall be paid for each complete dozen so delivered.

SEA-FISHING INDUSTRY ACTS, 1933 AND 1938.

The following Orders under Sections 3 and 4 respectively of the Sea-Fishing Industry Act, 1933, as amended by Section 38 of the Sea Fish Industry Act, 1938, have been made by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for Scotland, and (in the case of the Order under Section 3) the Secretary of State for the Home Department:-

THE SEA-FISHING INDUSTRY (FISHING NETS) ORDER, 1938.

This Order revokes and substantially reproduces the Sea-Fishing Industry (Fishing Nets) Order, 1937, and provides that no fishing boat registered in the United Kingdom shall carry, for the purpose of catching sea fish (other than herrings, pilchards or shrimps) in any waters outside the three-mile limit, any trawl or seine-net, or any other net having a bag or cod-end, which has in any part of the net a smaller mesh than is specified in the Order.

THE SEA-FISHING INDUSTRY (IMMATURE SEA-FISH) ORDER, 1938.

This Order revokes the Sea-Fishing Industry (Immature Sea-Fish) Order, 1933, dated July 29th, 1933, and the Sea-Fishing Industry (Immature Sea-Fish) Order, 1934, dated April 11th, 1934, and provides that no person in Great Britain shall land, sell, expose or offer for sale, or have in his possession for the purpose of sale, any seafish of specified descriptions of less than the specified sizes. These descriptions and sizes remain the same as in the previous Orders.
