Whereas it is provided by subsection (1) of section six of the Architects Registration Act, 1938, that that Act shall not extend to Northern Ireland unless and until provision to that effect is made by an Order of His Majesty in Council made in pursuance of a resolution passed by both Houses of the Parliament of Northern Ireland and any such Order may make such adaptations of the said Act in its application to Northern Ireland as may appear to His Majesty in Council to be necessary:

And whereas such a resolution as is required by the said subsection has been passed by both Houses of the said Parliament:

NOW, THEREFORE, His Majesty, in pursuance of the said resolution and by virtue of all powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Architects Registration Act, 1938, shall extend to Northern Ireland subject to the adaptation contained in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

For the definition of the expression "local authority" in subsection (2) of section one of the

Architects Registration Act, 1938, there shall be substituted the following definition—

The expression "local authority" means any council, board, commissioners or committee, whose accounts are, under any enactment, subject to audit by an auditor appointed by the Ministry of Home Affairs.

MARKETING OF EGGS (DETERMINATION OF WHOLESALE DEALERS' PRICES) (No. 51) ORDER (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1938.

- (ii) For hen eggs purchased by a licensed wholesale dealer of Class A from a licensed wholesale dealer of Class B, 1/07-16d. per lb.

Deductions:—Seconds $\frac{1}{2}$ d per egg;
Rejects $1\frac{1}{2}$ d. per egg.

- (b) For duck eggs purchased from a producer 1/5d. per dozen.

Where the eggs were delivered by the vendor to premises used by a licensed wholesale dealer of Class A for the testing, grading, and packing of eggs, or to a collecting depot specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order, an additional three-farthings shall be paid for each complete dozen so delivered.

GOVERNMENT LOANS.

(3) The purchase, erection, extension or alteration of school buildings.

Not exceeding 35 years† ... 3½ per cent.

(ii) Public Elementary Schools—

For the purchase, erection or improvement of schools under the Schools and Training Colleges (Ireland) Act, 1884, and the Education Acts (Northern Ireland, 1923-1931—

(D) NEW INDUSTRIES:—

IV. OTHER LOANS.

The rate of interest to be charged on local, land and works, and development loans other than those defined in Parts I, II and III of this notice will be determined by the ministry of Finance, according to the circumstances of each individual case.

Loans marked † above are repayable by an annuity or rent charge, calculated to include interest at the rates specified. Loans marked * above are repayable by equal half-yearly instalments of the principal advanced, together with interest on the balance from time to time outstanding. SEA-FISHING INDUSTRY ACTS, 1933 and 1938.

For the purpose of removing doubts which have been expressed as to the continued validity of previous Orders, the following Orders dated the 16th December, 1938, have been made under the Sea-Fishing Industry Act, 1933 (as amended by the Sea Fish Industry Act, 1938).

- (1) The Sea-Fishing Industry (Fishing Nets) Order, 1938, prescribing a minimum size of mesh for trawl, seine and other similar kinds of nets used by any fishing boat registered in the United Kingdom for fishing outside territorial waters for fish other than herrings, pilchards or shrimps.
- (2) The Sea-Fishing Industry (Immature Sea Fish) Order, 1938, regulating the landing and sale of undersized fish in Great Britain.

These Orders come into operation on the 1st January next and the only alteration of substance which they make is that in accordance with the Act of 1938 the landing as well as the sale of undersized fish is prohibited. The kinds of fish to which this Order applies and the minimum sizes remain as follow:—

Hake, thirteen inches long;
Haddock, nine and a half inches long;
Whiting, nine and a half inches long;
Dabs, nine inches long;
Lemon Soles, nine inches long;
Megrimms, nine inches long;
Plaice, nine inches long;
Soles, nine inches long;
Witches, nine inches long.
