#### MARKETING OF EGGS (DETERMINATION OF WHOLESALE DEALERS' PRICES) ORDER (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1938.

Notice is hereby given that an Order has been made by the Ministry of Agriculture determining that the prices payable by licensed wholesale dealers for eggs delivered during the week ended Saturday, 7th January, 1939, shall be as follows:—

- (a) (i) For hen eggs purchased from a producer, 1/- per lb.

Where the eggs were delivered by the vendor to premises used by a licensed wholesale dealer of Class A for the testing, grading, and packing of eggs, or to a collecting depot specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order, an additional halfpenny per lb. shall be paid.

- (ii) For hen eggs purchased by a licensed wholesale dealer of Class A from a licensed wholesale dealer of Class B, 1/07-16d. per lb.

Deductions:—Seconds  $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per egg;  
Rejects  $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per egg.

- (b) For duck eggs purchased from a producer 1/6d. per dozen.

Where the eggs were delivered by the vendor to premises used by a licensed wholesale dealer of Class A for the testing, grading, and packing of eggs, or to a collecting depot specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order, an additional three-farthings shall be paid for each complete dozen so delivered.

#### AGRICULTURAL MARKETING (PIG INDUSTRY) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934.

#### DETERMINATION OF PIG INDUSTRY COUNCIL FOR NORTHERN IRELAND.

The Pig Industry Council for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Section Five of the Agricultural Marketing (Pig Industry) Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, hereby determine as follows:—

As and from the ninth day of January, 1939, the Determination of the Council dated 30th December, 1937, and approved by the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland on the 31st December, 1937, as amended with the approval of the said Ministry on the 28th December, 1938, shall be amended and have effect as follows:—

- (1) The following proviso shall be substituted for the proviso to Section C of Part I:—

"Provided that the price for such pigs sold alive to the Pigs Marketing Board (Northern Ireland) and not resold to Wiltshire curers in Northern Ireland shall be on the basis of a live weight price per cwt. equivalent to the corresponding dead weight price for pigs sold alive under direct contract to Wiltshire curers in Northern Ireland."

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in Sections C and D of Part I, the price for pigs sold alive to the Pigs Marketing Board (Northern Ireland), weighing more than 1 cwt. 2 qr. 3 lb. dead weight and resold to Wiltshire curers in Northern Ireland shall be on a dead weight basis in accordance with the corresponding dead weight price for such pigs sold alive under direct contract to Wiltshire curers in Northern Ireland.
