MARKETING OF EGGS (DETERMINATION OF WHOLESALE DEALERS' PRICES) (No. 26) ORDER (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1939.

Notice is hereby given that an Order has been made by the Ministry of Agriculture determining that the prices payable by licensed wholesale dealers for eggs delivered during the week ended Saturday, 1st July, 1939, shall be as follows:—

(a) (i) For hen eggs purchased from a producer 8½d. per lb.

Where the eggs were delivered by the vendor to premises used by a licensed wholesale dealer of Class A for the testing, grading, and packing of eggs, or to a collecting depot specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order, an additional halfpenny per lb. shall be paid.

- (ii) For hen eggs purchased by a licensed wholesale dealer of Class A from a licensed wholesale dealer of Class B, 9 3-16d. per lb.
Deductions:—Seconds ½d per egg;
Rejects 1¼d. per egg.
- (b) For duck eggs purchased from a producer 9½d. per dozen.

Where the eggs were delivered by the vendor to premises used by a licensed wholesale dealer of Class A for the testing, grading, and packing of eggs, or to a collecting depot specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order, an additional three-farthings shall be paid for each complete dozen so delivered.

Deductions:—Rejects ¾d. per egg.

SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES
ACT, 1921.

AMENDMENT OF LIST OF ARTICLES
CHARGEABLE WITH DUTY UNDER
PART I.

(Safeguarding of Key Industries)

1. Section 1 (5) of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, provides that for the purpose of preventing disputes arising as to whether any goods are or are not chargeable with duty under Part I of the Act, the Board of Trade may from time to time issue lists defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under any of the general descriptions set out in the Schedule to the Act, and where any list is so issued defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under such general description, the said Schedule shall have effect as if the articles comprised in the lists were therein substituted for that general description.

2. Section 5 (3) of the Finance Act, 1936, provides, amongst other things, that the power of the Board of Trade under sub-section (5) of Section I of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, to issue lists defining articles which are to be taken as falling under any of the general descriptions set out in the Schedule to that Act shall include power to amend any list so issued.

3. The Board of Trade hereby amend List H issued in 1921 by deleting mercury chloride and substituting mercury subchloride.

The Pig Industry Council for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as the "Council") in exercise of their powers under Section Five of the Agricultural Marketing (Pig Industry) Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, hereby determine as follows:—

As and from the first day of July, 1939, the Determination of the Council dated 30th December, 1937, and approved by the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland on the 31st December, 1937, as amended with the approval of the said Ministry on the 28th December, 1938, the 7th January, 1939, and the 27th February, 1939, shall be amended to such extent as is necessary in order that the same may be read and have effect as follows:—

The words "On a dead weight basis in accordance with the basic Roll and Ham pig price, with a premium of 5/- per cwt., or such other amount as the Council may from time to time determine" immediately following the words "C. For pigs sold alive to the Pigs Marketing Board (Northern Ireland) and resold to Wiltshire curers in Northern Ireland," in the Determination dated 27th February, 1939, shall be deleted and the following substituted therefor:—

"On a dead weight basis in accordance with the basic Roll and Ham pig price with a premium of 4/- per cwt., or such other amount as the Council may from time to time determine."
