MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND.

PUBLIC HEALTH (PRESERVATIVES, ETC., IN FOOD) (NORTHERN IRELAND), AMENDMENT REGULATIONS, 1939.

Notice is hereby given that the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, the Public Health Act, 1896, the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1896, the Public Health (Regulations as to Food) Act, 1907, and the Butter and Margarine Act, 1907, and of every other power enabling the Ministry in that behalf, has made further regulations regarding the use of preservatives, etc., in food in Northern Ireland.

The object of these regulations is to amend in certain respects the provisions of the original regulations made by the Ministry on the 15th day of February, 1927, so as to allow within limits the use of nitrites in the manufacture of bacon, ham, or cooked pickled meat.

MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934-1938.

DETERMINATION OF THE JOINT MILK COUNCIL FOR NORTHERN IRELAND IN RESPECT OF THE PERIOD 31st DECEMBER, 1939, TO 30th SEPTEMBER, 1940.

The Joint Milk Council for Northern Ireland in exercise of its powers under Section Six of the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, hereby determines as follows:—

The Determination of the Joint Milk Council dated 26th August, 1939, as amended by the Determination dated 18th November, 1939, shall have effect, subject to the following amendments:—

PART II. SALE BY CONTRACT.

The form of contract prescribed in the Schedule to the Determination of the 26th August, 1939, shall be deemed to include the following proviso to Part I (operative Part) Paragraph 2:—

Provided that fines shall not be payable by the producer if he can show to the satisfaction of the Ministry of Agriculture, after consultation with the distributor concerned, that the default was attributable to circumstances outside his control. In such circumstances, however, if the distributor finds it necessary to complete other contracts for the purpose of obtaining the quantity by which the delivery under this contract falls short of the Contract Quantity, he shall be relieved of the liability under this contract to accept the said quantity.

PART III. RETAIL PRICES.

(b) In the Boroughs of Coleraine, Ballymena and Larne, and the Urban Districts of Armagh, Ballymoney, Banbridge, Dungannon, Enniskillen, Lurgan, Newry, Omagh, Portadown and Strabane:

(i) from the 31st day of December, 1939, to the 30th day of April, 1940, inclusive,

Milk of Grade A—not less than 2/4d. per gallon.

Milk of Grade B—not less than 2/2d. per gallon.

Milk of Grade C—not less than 2/- per gallon.

(ii) from the 1st day of May, 1940, to the 30th day of September, 1940, inclusive,

Milk of Grade A—not less than 2/2d. per gallon.

Milk of Grade B—not less than 2/- per gallon.

Milk of Grade C—not less than 1/10d. per gallon.

(c) In the Urban Districts of Ballycastle, Donaghadee, Newcastle, Portrush, Portstewart, Warrenpoint and Whitehead:

from the 31st day of December, 1939, to the 30th day of September, 1940, inclusive,

Milk of Grade A—not less than 2/4d. per gallon.

Milk of Grade B—not less than 2/2d. per gallon.

Milk of Grade C—not less than 2/- per gallon.

(d) In all other areas in Northern Ireland:

(i) from the 31st day of December, 1939, to the 30th day of April, 1940, inclusive:—

Milk of Grade A—not less than 2/2d. per gallon.

Milk of Grade B—not less than 2/- per gallon.

Milk of Grade C—not less than 1/10d. per gallon.

(ii) from the 1st day of May, 1940, to the 30th day of September, 1940, inclusive,

Milk of Grade A—not less than 2/- per gallon.

Milk of Grade B—not less than 1/10d. per gallon.

Milk of Grade C—not less than 1/8d. per gallon.

Provided that the prices at which milk of Grade B or milk of Grade C may be sold shall not exceed the following prices during the periods specified:

31st day of December, 1939, to 30th day of June, 1940, and 1st day of September, 1940, to 30th day of September, 1940,

Milk of Grade B—2/4d. per gallon.

Milk of Grade C—2/2d. per gallon.

1st day of July, 1940, to 31st day of August, 1940,

Milk of Grade B—2/2d. per gallon.

Milk of Grade C—2/- per gallon.

PART IV. GENERAL.

This Determination may be varied or amended by a subsequent determination of the Joint Milk Council.
