**CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL
POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN
IRELAND), 1922 and 1933.**

Whereas by Regulation 26 of the Regulations contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts (Northern Ireland), 1922 and 1933, it is provided that the Civil Authority may by notice prohibit the circulation of any newspaper for any specified period, and that any person circulating or distributing such newspaper within such specified period shall be guilty of an offence against the Regulations in the said Schedule:

Now I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Bart., D.L., M.P., Minister

of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, being the Civil Authority under the said Act, do hereby in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 26 of the Regulations made under the authority of the above-mentioned Acts, prohibit the circulation of the newspaper entitled—

“THE DERRY JOURNAL”

or under any other title or alias whatever in Northern Ireland from the 3rd day of June, 1940, until the 31st day of December, 1940.

**NORTHERN IRELAND LAND ACT, 1925
(15 and 16 Geo. V. Chapter 34).**

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury give notice that pursuant to Section 2 of the Northern Ireland Land Act, 1925, they have authorised the further creation of £1,590 Guaranteed 4½ per cent. Bonds, including £1,590 such Bonds for issue to the National Debt Commissioners and making with the amounts previously authorised a total of £6,567,520 such Bonds.
