The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April 1872, and amended by subsequent notices in the London Gazette) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Assistant



Keeper in the South Kensington Museum (Art Branch).

*N.B.*—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

I. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 30, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the competitive Examination.

II. The Examination will consist of two parts, and will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

#### PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1. Handwriting.
2. Orthography.
3. Arithmetic (including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions).
4. English Composition.
5. Translation from Latin, French, or German into English.

\* \* No candidate who fails to show satisfactory proficiency in any of the subjects specified above will be admitted to the competitive part of the Examination.

IV. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as the Commissioners may appoint.

A Preliminary Examination will be held in London on the 17th June 1890.
