The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

Special Regulations (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April 1872, and amended by subsequent notices in the London Gazette) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Assistant

Keeper in the South Kensington Museum (Art Branch).

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

I. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 30, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the competitive Examination.

II. The Examination will consist of two parts, and will be in the following subjects, viz. :-

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

- Orthography.
 Arithmetic (including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions).
- 4. English Composition.
- 5. Translation from Latin, French, or German into English.
 - *** No candidate who fails to show satisfactory proficiency in any of the subjects specified above will be admitted to the competitive part of the Examination.

 (b) The Industrial Arts, taking the Handbook prepared by Mr. W. 500 Maskell for the Department of Science and Art, as a Text Book. 500

Labarte—Arts of the Middle Ages 500 D'Anvers-History of Art . 400

Any other subject or subjects which the authorities of the Science and Art Department may on any occasion prescribe.

> ** No Candidate will be eligible who does not show a competent knowledge of each of the Obligatory subjects which he takes up.

In order to secure a proper proficiency in all the subjects taken up by a Candidate, a certain number will be deducted from the marks obtained by each Candidate in each subject.

III. A fee of £1 will be required from each Candidate attending the Preliminary Examination, and a further fee of £5 from each Candidate who may be admitted to the Competitive part.

IV. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as the Commissioners may appoint.
