(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Con-

tagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Each of the Places described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.
2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after this thirtieth day of September one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

2. A Place comprising the byre at Lauderberry, in the occupation of Mr. James Kinghorn, in the Parish of Echt, in the County of Aberdeen.
