(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE INFECTED ZONE.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The limits of the following district or area which is declared by Order of the Board dated the thirteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Zone (namely),—comprising the burghs of Edinburgh, Leith, Musselburgh, and Portobello, and also comprising the county of Edinburgh (Mid-Lothian) except that portion thereof known as the Gala Water District in the south-eastern corner of the county consisting of the parishes of Stow, Temple, Crichton, Heriot, Borthwick, Fala and Soutra, and Cranston; and also except that portion of the Calder District of the county consisting of the parishes of Mid-Calder, West Calder, and Kirknewton,—are hereby extended so as to include the district or area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the district or area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Zone, and shall be subject to the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Order of 1892, No. 2, dated the sixth day of April one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Zones and of any Order amending the same.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after this nineteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

### *Description of Infected Zone.*

A district or area comprising the burghs of Edinburgh, Leith, Musselburgh, and Portobello, and also comprising the county of Edinburgh (Mid-Lothian) except the parishes of Stow, Mid-Calder, West Calder, and Kirknewton.

## PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT FROM EDINBURGH ORDER OF 1892.

By the Board of Agriculture.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything in any Order of the Board of Agriculture, no cattle, sheep, or swine shall, from and after the commencement of this Order, be moved out of the District of the Local Authority of the burgh of Edinburgh.

2. If a head of cattle or a sheep or a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

3. This Order may be cited as THE PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT FROM EDINBURGH ORDER OF 1892.

4. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after this twentieth day of April one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.
