

By the Board of Agriculture.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1892, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby, from and after the commencement of this Order, revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not revive any Order revoked by or otherwise affect the past operation of the Order hereby revoked, or invalidate or make unlawful anything done thereunder, or affect any licence or authority granted, or any right, title, obligation, or liability accrued thereunder before the com-

mencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the sixth day of February one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.
