PORTSEA ISLAND BUILDING SOCIETY.

(Appointment of Arbitrator or Arbitrators to settle affairs of the Society. Appointment and Duties of Liquidators. Distribution of Assets. Staying of Actions. Amendment of Acts and for other purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given,—That application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill and to pass an Act for the following among other purposes or some of them (that is to say)

To refer to an Arbitrator or Arbitrators to be named in the said intended Bill the relative rights liabilities and interests of the members and depositors of the Portsea Island Building Society hereinafter called 'the Society.'

The settlement of a scheme for the final winding up or arrangement of the affairs of the Society.

To give powers to the Arbitrator or Arbitrators and to make his or their awards binding on all the members and depositors of the Society and to provide for the enforcement thereof.

To give to the Arbitrator or Arbitrators of jurisdiction over pending proceedings relating to the matters to be referred.

The Bill will or may provide for the confirmation of the appointment of Liquidators and for conferring upon them such rights, powers and functions, under the supervision of the Home Office or Board of Trade as may be necessary or expedient for carrying into effect the winding up of the affairs of the Society as in the Bill provided, and for such amendment of the Society's rules as are required to carry out the objects of the Bill.

To provide for the distribution of the assets of the Society among the members and depositors thereof rateably and in equal proportions according to the amount credited to them respectively.

To authorise and require the concurrence in such equal proportionate division of the Society's assets of any trustee, executor, administrator, receiver, manager, liquidator, or committee, or any *cestui que trust*, beneficiary or legatee of or under any existing or future deed, will, settlement, letters of administration, bankruptcy, liquidation, proceedings in lunacy, or other instrument or proceeding whatsoever by or under which any trust is or may be created and to provide that the receipts of minors, being members or depositors, for the dividends payable to them under the Bill shall operate as a full discharge.

To make provision for staying or to stay all actions suits and proceedings against the Society or the Liquidators respectively in respect of all alleged priorities of interest in the Society's assets or other rights affecting the same.

To alter amend and enlarge and so far as may be necessary for the purposes aforesaid, the Building Societies Act, 1874, and any Act applicable in the winding up of the Society.

To vary and extinguish any existing rights and privileges which might interfere with or

prevent the execution of the purposes of the intended Act and to confer all such powers, rights, and privileges as may be necessary for carrying the same into effect.

And Notice is hereby given,—That printed copies of the said intended Act have been deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.
