ORDINANCE No. 51.

[ABERDEEN, NO. 8. — SUPPLEMENTARY TO ORDINANCE NO. 26 (ABERDEEN, NO. 2.— REGULATIONS AS TO APPLICATION OF PARLIA-MENTARY GRANTS, AS TO SALARIES AND FOR THE INSTITUTION OF A FEE FUND, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES).]

At Edinburgh, the thirty-first day of March eighteen hundred and ninety-four years.

WHEREAS by the Universities (Scotland) Act, 1889, the Commissioners under the said Act are empowered by section 14, sub-section 5, to regulate the management and ordering of the Universities, and the manner and conditions in and under which students shall be admitted thereto, and in particular—(c) the awarding of compensation to existing Professors where compensation seems to the Commissioners to be equitably due, taking all the circumstances into account.
