## LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACTS.

Alteration of Parish Areas.

### PROPOSED ORDER No. XXIX.

PARISHES OF DALZIEL, HAMILTON, AND BOTHWELL.

WHEREAS it has been represented to me by the Parochial Board of the Parish of Dalziel, the Commissioners of the Police Burgh of Motherwell, and the School Board of Dalziel, that I should issue an Order under section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, and section 46 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1894, readjusting the boundaries of the Parishes of Dalziel, Hamilton, and Bothwell;

And whereas, after consulting with the Authorities concerned, and causing a local inquiry to be held, I am of opinion that it is expedient to give effect to the said representation;

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir

George Otto Trevelyan, Baronet, Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do, in virtue of the powers conferred upon the Secretary for Scotland by the Local Government (Scotland) Acts, order as follows:—

1. The portion of the Parish of Hamilton situated to the north and east of the River Clyde shall cease to be part of that Parish, and shall form part of the Parish of Dalziel; and the under-mentioned portions of the Parish of Bothwell shall cease to be parts of that Parish, and shall form parts of the Parish of Dalziel, namely,—(1) That portion within which is situated Dalziel Cemetery, bounded as follows:—On the east by ground belonging to the Caledonian Railway Company at Jerviston old wooden viaduct, on the north by the road leading from Jerviston House to the public road at Camp, on the north-west by the public road leading from Jerviston west gate by way of Camp to Camp Bridge across the Calder, and on the west and south by the River Calder; (2) that portion of the Parish of Bothwell which is situated in the Police Burgh of Motherwell, and bounded as follows,—on the west, south-west, and east by the River Calder, and the north and east by parts and portions of the estate of Jerviston, lying in the Parish of Bothwell; (3) that part of the parish of Bothwell lying immediately northward of the part immediately above described, and bounded as follows, viz. on the east by the plantation immediately adjoining on Jerviston Estate, thence along the south side of Jerviston Avenue to the lodge on the Carfin Road, thence across the said road to the line of the field shown on the Ordnance Survey plan skirting the plantation on the south-east, thence along said plantation in a

straight line running south-west to the present boundary of Motherwell Police Burgh at the Public Park, and on the south and east by the part or portion of ground immediately above described.

2. The portion of the Parish of Dalziel situated to the south of the River Clyde, and known as the district of Cunniegair, shall cease to be part of the Parish of Dalziel, and shall form part of the Parish of Hamilton.

3. The Parish Council of Dalziel shall assume responsibility for, and shall relieve the Parish Council of Hamilton and the Parish Council of Bothwell of all advances which the two latter bodies may respectively be called upon to make for or on account of, any pauper whose claim is derived (1) from birth in the said portions of the Parishes of Hamilton and Bothwell prior to the 2nd day of August 1895, or (2) from residence for the statutory period in the said portions of the Parishes of Hamilton and Bothwell prior to the 2nd day of August 1895.

4. The Parish Council of Hamilton shall assume responsibility for, and shall relieve the Parish Council of Dalziel of all advances which the latter body may be called upon to make for or on account of, any pauper whose claim is derived (1) from birth in the aforesaid portion of the Parish of Dalziel situated to the south of the River Clyde prior to the 2nd day of August 1895, or (2) from residence for the statutory period in the said portion of the Parish of Dalziel prior to the 2nd day of August 1895.

5. (1) The Parish Councillor elected for the Dalziel Ward of the landward part of the Parish of Hamilton shall become a Parish Councillor for the landward part of the Parish of Dalziel.

(2) The three Parish Councillors elected for that portion of the Parish of Hamilton which is within the Police Burgh of Motherwell, shall become Parish Councillors of the Parish of Dalziel for the Second Ward of the Police Burgh of Motherwell.

(3) The Parish Councillor elected for that portion of the Parish of Bothwell which is within the Police Burgh of Motherwell, shall become a Parish Councillor of the Parish of Dalziel for the Third Ward of the said Police Burgh of Motherwell.

6. The Parish Councils of the Parishes of Dalziel and Hamilton as constituted by this Order shall respectively meet on the 2nd day of August 1895, and such meetings shall respectively be deemed to be the first statutory meetings of the said Parish Councils.

7. Nothing herein contained shall affect the rights of Creditors or of persons having vested interests, and all questions of adjustment consequential on this Order are expressly reserved.

This Order shall take effect on the 2nd day of August 1895.
