WILD BIRDS PROTECTION ACTS, 1880 to 1894.

COUNTY OF KIRKCUDBRIGHT.

ORDER by the Secretary for Scotland.

In pursuance of the powers conferred up me by the "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894," and upon application by the County Council of the County of Kirkcudbright, I, the Right Honourable Alexander Hugh, Lord Balfour of Burleigh, Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following Order:—

r. The taking or destroying the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the entire County of Kirkcudbright during the currency of this Order, viz.:—
