[^0]:    - Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where retarns of parchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returas in any other measare than the imperial boshel, or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Offcer shall convert such returns into the imperial bnsheh and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bashel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bashel of barley, and thirty-nine - imperial ponnds for every busbel of oats.
