COUNTY OF LANARK.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894," and upon application by the County Council of the County of Lanark, I, the Right Honourable Alexander Hugh, Lord Balfour of Burleigh, Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following Order :—

1. The taking or destroying the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the entire County of Lanark during the currency of this Order, viz. :—

 Short-eared Owl (*Asio accipitrinus*).

 Goatsucker (*Caprimulgus europæus*).
 Grebe (*Podiceps fluviatilis*).
 Mallard (*Anas boscas*).
 Sealark or Dunlin (*Tringa Alpina*).
 Snipe (*Gallinago cœlestis*).
 Teal (*Querquedula crecca*).
 Wigeon (*Mareca penelope*).
 Woodcock (*Scolopax rusticula*).

2. The taking or destroying the eggs of the Lapwing (*Vanellus cristatus*) is prohibited throughout the entire County of Lanark, after the 15th day of April in each year during the currency of this Order.

3. This Order shall take effect on the 15th day of March 1897, and shall remain in force for one year from that day.
