1. The taking or destroying the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the entire County of Lanark during the currency of this Order, viz.:—

Black capped or Black headed Gull (Larus ridibundus), Barn Owl (Strix flammea). Long-eared Owl (Asio otus). Short-eared Owl (Asio accipitrinus). Tawny Owl (Syrnium aluco). Tern (common) (Sterna fluviatilis). Curlew (Numenius arquata). Goatsucker (Caprimulgus europæus). Grebe (Podicipes fluviatilis). Mallard (Anas boscas). Sealark or Dunlin (Tringa Alpina). Snipe (Gallinago cœlestis). Teal (Querquedula crecca). Wigeon (Mareca penelope). Woodcock (Scolopax rusticula).

- 2. The taking or destroying the eggs of the Lapwing (Vanellus cristatus) is prohibited throughout the entire County of Lanark, after the 15th day of April in each year during the currency of this Order.
- 3. This Order shall take effect on the 15th day of March 1897, and shall remain in force for one year from that day.
