Extension of District to which the Colinton (Mid-Lothian) District Swine Fever Order of 1897 applies.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the District described in the Schedule to this Order shall be deemed to be substituted for the District described in the Schedule to the Colinton (Mid-Lothian) District Swine Fever Order of 1897, dated the first day of February one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and that Order shall be read and have effect accordingly.

## Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of June one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.

## Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the Colinton (Mid-Lothian) District Swine Fever Amendment Order of 1897.

A District comprising portions of the Parishes of Colinton and Liberton, and the whole of the Parish of Corstorphine, in Mid-Lothian (County of Edinburgh), bounded on the east by the west side of Morningside Road from the City of Edinburgh boundary to the Parish boundary of Colinton near Lothianburn, thence on the south and west by the boundary of the Parish of Colinton until it joins the boundary of the Parish of Corstorphine, thence along the western boundary of the Parish of Corstorphine to Lenny Moor, thence eastward along the northern boundary of the Parish of Corstorphine until it joins the City of Edinburgh boundary near Blackhall, and thence in a southerly direction along the City of Edinburgh boundary to Morningside Road aforesaid.
