(4) Candidates for Honours in Economic Science (Group i of Section XI. hereof), who take Moral Philosophy as their supplementary Honours subject, may take a half course in the History of Civil Law and a half course in the Philosophy of Law, which, together, shall be deemed to constitute one of the subjects in which the standard of examination is that required for the ordinary degree of Master of Arts.

IV. This Ordinance shall come into force from and after the date on which it is approved by Her Majesty in Council.

VACCINATION ACT.

PARISH OF KILMORY, BUTE.

OTICE is hereby given that, in terms of the 12th section of the Vaccination (Scotland) Act, 1863, 26 and 27 Vict. cap. 108, and upon application by the Parish Council of Kilmory, in the County of Bute, the Local Government Board have recalled, with the approval of the Lord Advocate, in conformity with the Act, the modifications of the 8th section of the said Act, dated 21st February 1866, so far as regards the said Parish of Kilmory.

Accordingly the 8th section of the Vaccination (Scotland) Act, 1863, will henceforth apply to the Parish of Kilmory without modification, as hereinafter expressed, viz.:—

"8. The father of every child born in Scotland after the first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the event of the death, illness, or inability of the father, then the mother, or in the event of the death, illness, absence, or inability of the father and mother, then the person who shall have the care, nurture, or custody of such child, shall, within six months after the birth of such child, cause such child to be vaccinated by a medical practitioner; and upon and immediately after the successful vaccination of such child, the medical practitioner who shall have performed the operation shall deliver to the father or mother of such child, or to the person who shall have the care, nurture, or custody of such child, a certificate under his hand, according to the form of the Schedule (A) hereto sunexed, that such child has been successfully vaccinated; and such certificate shall, within three days after the date thereof, be transmitted to and lodged with the Registrar for the district by the father, mother, or person aforesaid, and such certificate, if registered, shall, without further proof, be admissible as evidence of the successful vaccination of such child in any information or complaint which shall be brought against the father, mother, or person aforesaid for non-compliance with the provisions of this Act."
