WILD BIRDS PROTECTION ACTS,
1880 to 1896.

COUNTY OF KINCARDINE.

ORDER by the Secretary for Scotland.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894," and upon application by the County Council of the County of Kincardine, I, the Right Honourable Alexander Hugh, Lord Balfour of Burleigh, Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following Order:—

1. The taking or destroying the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the entire County of Kincardine during the currency of this Order, viz. :—

- Buzzard (*Buteo vulgaris*).
- Goldfinch (*Carduelis elegans*).
- Great Crested Grebe (*Podiceps cristatus*).
- Jay (*Garrulus glandarius*).
- Kestrel (*Falco tinnunculus*).
- Kingfisher (*Alcedo ispida*).
- Mallard (*Anas boscas*).
- Osprey (*Pandion haliaëtus*).
- Owl—Barn (*Strix flammea*).
- Owl—Long-eared (*Asio otus*).
- Owl—Short-eared (*Asio accipitrinus*).
- Owl—Tawny (*Syrnium aluco*).
- Peregrine Falcon (*Falco peregrinus*).
- Poachard (*Fuligula ferina*).
- Quail (*Coturnix communis*).
- Shoveller (*Spatula clypeata*).
- Snipe (*Gallinago cœlestis*).
- Teal (*Querquedula crecca*).
- Tern—Common (*Sterna fluviatilis*).
- Tern—Little (*Sterna minuta*).

- Tufted Duck (*Fuligula cristata*).
- Wigeon (*Mareca penelope*).
- Woodcock (*Scolopax rusticola*).
- Black-throated Diver (*Colymbus arcticus*).
- Dotterel (*Eudromias morinellus*).
- Greenshank (*Totanus glottis*).
- Kite (*Milvus ictinus*).
- Merlin (*Falco æsalon*).
- Sparrow Hawk (*Accipiter nisus*).

2. The taking or destroying the eggs of the Lapwing (*Vanelus cristatus*) is prohibited throughout the entire County of Kincardine, after the 15th day of April in each year during the currency of this Order.

3. The "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," shall apply within the County of Kincardine during the currency of this Order to the following species of Wild Birds as if they had been included in the Schedule to the said Act, viz. :—

- Peregrine Falcon (*Falco peregrinus*).
- Merlin (*Falco æsalon*).
- Kestrel (*Falco tinnunculus*).
- Sparrow Hawk (*Accipiter nisus*).
- European Dipper (*Cinclus europæus*).
- Warblers (all kinds) (*Sylviidae*).
- Ox Eye Tit (*Parus fringillago*).
- Blue Tit (*Parus cœruleus*).

4. This Order shall take effect on the 1st day of September 1897, and shall remain in force for one year from that day.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Secretary for Scotland has this day confirmed the following Bye-Law passed by the Fishery Board for Scotland, viz. :—

BYE-LAW (No. 15) made by the Fishery Board for Scotland, under the powers conferred on the Board by the Sea Fisheries Regulation (Scotland) Act, 1895.

I. Whereas by the Act 58 and 59 Vict. cap. 42, being the Sea Fisheries Regulation (Scotland) Act, 1895, it is enacted (Section 13) that a Fishery District Committee may, subject to such regulations as may be made in that behalf by the Fishery Board for Scotland, impose penalties, and also make Bye-Laws, for, *inter alia*, prohibiting the removal or taking of Mussels below a certain specified size from any part of the sea adjoining Scotland, and (Section 26) that the said Fishery Board for Scotland shall, in respect of any parts of Scotland where there is no Fishery District Committee, have all the powers to make Bye-Laws and impose penalties given in the said Act to Fishery District Committees, it is hereby declared that it shall not be lawful to remove or take from the Estuary of the River Tay, or that portion of the sea immediately adjoining it, Mussels under one inch in length.

II. For the purposes of this Bye-Law, the limits of the Estuary of the River Tay, and that portion of the sea immediately adjoining it, shall be as follows, viz. :—On the west, a straight line drawn from the west end of Monifieth Railway Station on the north to Tents Moor Point on the south; on the east, the North British Railway bridge crossing the Estuary of the River Tay; and on the north and south, high water mark of equinoctial spring tides.

III. If any person acts in contravention of this Bye-Law, he shall be liable to a fine not exceeding the sum of £15 and forfeiture of any fishing instrument used or Mussels taken in contravention of, or found in the possession of, such person contravening this Bye-Law.

IV. This Bye-Law shall come into force from the date of its confirmation by the Secretary for Scotland.
