

Revocation.

1. The Orders described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby, from and after the commencement of this Order, revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under either of those Orders before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, either of the Orders hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the COLINTON (MID-LOTHIAN) DISTRICT SWINE FEVER REVOCATION ORDER OF 1897.

* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel, or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
