EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875.

NOTICE is hereby given that, after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to Her Majesty in Council, in pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, the draft of an Order in Council declaring Acetylene, when liquid, or when subject to a certain atmospheric pressure, and when not specially exempted by an Order of the Secretary of State, to be an explosive within the meaning of "The Explosives Act, 1875," and prohibiting its being manufactured, kept, conveyed, or sold.
