THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby, from and after the commencement of this Order, revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything

done under the Swine Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896, and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-seventh day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.
