ORDERS for all persons who appear at Her Majesty's Castle of Dublin, to put on Mourning for Her late Imperial Majesty The Empress of Austria, Queen of Hungary, viz. :—

The Ladies to wear black Dresses, white Gloves, black or white Shoes, Feathers, and Fans, Pearls, Diamonds, or plain gold or silver Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to wear black Court Dress, with black Swords and Buckles.

The Court to change the Mourning on Wednesday the 28th instant, viz. :—

The Ladies to wear black Dresses, with coloured Ribbons, Flowers, and Ornaments, or grey or white Dresses, with black Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers, and Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to continue the same Mourning.

And on Wednesday, the 12th October next, the Court to go out of Mourning.
