

London Gazette) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the Situation of Assistant Schoolmaster in Her Majesty's Dockyards in the Department of the Admiralty.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 20 and 35, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

2. No Candidate will be eligible who does not produce satisfactory proof of his ability and experience in teaching. Evidence on this point must be sent in at such times and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint. If it prove *prima facie* satisfactory, the Candidate will be admitted to Examination, subject to such further inquiry as may be necessary. In the case of a person who has been trained in one of Her Majesty's Dockyard Schools, a certificate from the President of the Royal Naval College that the Candidate possesses the requisite practical qualifications will be regarded by the Commissioners as satisfactory evidence.

3. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. Handwriting and Orthography.
2. English, including Composition, Grammar.
3. Physical and Political Geography of the World, especially of England and Europe.
4. English History.
5. Arithmetic, Mensuration, Euclid, Books I.-IV. and VI., Algebra, Plane Trigonometry.
6. Differential and Integral Calculus, and Plane Co-ordinate Geometry.
7. Statics, Dynamics, and Hydrostatics.
8. Chemistry and Physics.

No Candidate will be eligible who fails to pass in any of the first five subjects.

4. A fee of £2 will be required from each Candidate attending the Examination.

5. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as the Commissioners may appoint.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Examination for the situation of Assistant Schoolmaster in Her Majesty's Dockyards will be held in London, under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 10th January 1899.

The number of situations to be filled will be the number vacant at the time of the Examination.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 21st December 1898, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.
