of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, "The Gas Works Clauses Act, 1847," "The Gas Works Clauses Act, 1871," "The Lands Clauses Acts," "The Debenture Stock Act, 1871," and "The Local Loans Act, 1875," and any Act or Acts amending any of the said Acts, or to incorporate the said Acts or some of them or some parts thereof, and to apply the same or some of them or some parts thereof, with or without modification, amendment, alteration, or addition, to the undertaking of the Commissioners, and to the objects and purposes of the intended Bill.

6. To vary, amend, extend, alter, or repeal "The Dundee Gas Act, 1868," "The Dundee Gas Amendment Act, 1872," "The Dundee Gas (Additional Powers) Act, 1877," "The Dundee Gas ("The Dundee Gas") "The Dundee Gas ("The Gas") "The Dundee Gas" "The Dundee Gas" "The Dundee Gas") "The Dundee Gas" ("The Gas") "The Dundee Gas" "The Dund Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 14) Act, 1890," and "The Dundee Corporation Act, 1897," or one or other or more of these Acts or Order or some parts of the same or of one or other of them, and in particular to alter, amend, vary, and enlarge the provisions of the said Acts as to Estimates, Rates, Duties, Assessments, Charges, and Revenues, and the application thereof, and to authorise the Commissioners to alter existing Rates, Duties, Assessments, and Charges, and to make and levy new, additional, increased, and other Rates, Duties, Assessments, and Charges, or otherwise, and to confer, vary, or extinguish other rights and privileges.

7. To confer upon the Commissioners such other and additional rights, powers, and privileges, and to make such other provisions as the Bill may prescribe, for the better carrying out of the purposes and objects of the undertaking of the Commissioners and the Bill.

8. To alter, enlarge, and extend for municipal, police, and all other purposes the Municipal and Police boundaries (which are coincident and hereinafter called Municipal and Police boundary) of the City and Royal Burgh of Dundee (hereinafter called "the existing Burgh"), and to include and incorporate within the said Municipal and Police boundary the whole areas, lands, and territories or some part or parts thereof (hereinafter called "the districts to be added") within the Parish of Dundee, and the United Parish of Mains and Strathmartine, all in the County of Forfar, and within the United Parishes of Liff, Logie, Benvie, and Invergowrie (commonly, and hereinafter in this Notice, called the United Parish of Liff and Benvie), in the said County, hereinafter described, that is to say, (a) within the Parish of Dundee, and the United Parish of Mains and Strathmartine, and County aforesaid, the Areas, Lands, and Territory or some parts or part thereof, situated on the easterly side of the present Municipal and Police boundary of the existing Burgh, and within the following limits: that is to say-Commencing in the shore of the Firth of Tay at the southern extremity of the present easterly Municipal and Police boundary (being low water mark) of the existing Burgh, and from thence in a north-westerly direction along the said easterly boundary to a point in the centre of Pitkerro Road, Stobsmuir, being the eastmost point of the present northern municipal and police boundary

straight prolongation of the said present northern municipal and police boundary, to the point of intersection thereof by the northerly prolongation of a straight line from a point in the road leading from Dundee to Broughty Ferry, commonly called the Broughty Ferry Road, 125 yards eastward from the east boundary of the lands of Craigie (measured along the north side of Broughty Ferry Road) northwards to a point in the road leading from Dundee to Arbroath, 132 yards eastward from the said east boundary of the said lands of Craigie (measured along the south side of the said Dundee and Arbroath Road), and from said point of intersection southward along said prolongation and said straight line to the said Broughty Ferry Road, and therefrom in the di-rect southerly prolongation of the said straight Gas (Debenture Stock) Act, 1882," "The Dunce line to the shore of the Firth of Tay at low water dee Corporation Act, 1894," "The Dundee Electric Lighting Order, 1890," confirmed by "The mark on said shore to the point first described; and (b) within the said United Parish of Liff and Benvie and County aforesaid, the areas, lands, and territory, or some parts or part thereof, situated on the westerly side of the present Municipal and Police boundary of the existing Burgh and within the following limits, that is to say—Commencing in the shore of the Firth of Tay at the southern extremity of the present western Municipal and Police boundary (being low water mark) of the existing Burgh, and from thence northwards along the said western boundary to the centre of Liff Road, thence westwards along the centre of said Liff Road to a point therein near the south-west corner of Camperdown Policies, and at a distance of 100 yards (measured westwards along the centre of said Liff Road) from the extended centre line of the road leading southwards therefrom towards South Road and the Liff Station of the Caledonian Railway (Dundee and Newtyle Section), thence southward in a straight line to the point where the boundary of the County of Forfar with the County of Perth cuts the road leading from Dundee towards Perth, commonly called the Perth Road, thence southward along said Boundary of the County of Forfar to and along the recently corrected boundary of the said County of Forfar to the shore of the Firth of Tay at low water mark, and thence eartwards along the low water mark on said shore to the point first described; and to provide that the said Municipal and Police boundary as so extended (hereinafter called "the extended Burgh") shall be subject to the rules of construction laid down in "The Representation of the People (Scotland) Act, 1832."

9. To separate, detach, and disjoin for all purposes the districts to be added from the County of Forfar and from the jurisdiction of any County Council, County Road Board or Committee, District County Council or Committee, District Road Board or Committee, Commissioners of Supply, Road Trustees, and all other local bodies and authorities, or some of them, and to exempt the districts to be added from payment of County, highway, sanitary, district, local, and other Tolls, Rates, Cess, and Assessments, or some or one of them, now leviable or which might be levied under any existing Act within the districts to be added; and to transfer to the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the City and Royal Burgh of of the existing Burgh, and being opposite to bundee (hereinafter called "the Corporation"), where the said Pitkerro Road is joined by the all or some of the powers and authorities Old Craigie Road, thence eastwards in the exerciseable by any such County Council, Dundee (hereinafter called "the Corporation"),
