It is hereby notified that the Marquis of Salisbury, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received a Telegraphic Despatch from Rear-Admiral Noel, commanding Her Majesty's Naval Forces in Cretan Waters, to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, announcing that the Admirals in command of the British, French, Italian, and Russian Naval Forces have issued a Notification to the effect that the Blockade of the Island of Crete, established on the 21st of March 1897 (of which notice was given in the London Gazette of the 19th of March 1897), is raised from the 5th December, but that the importation of arms and munitions of war into Crete is absolutely prohibited.

#### CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION, December 13, 1898.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS respecting Temporary Boy Messengers in Government Departments.

- 1. A Register of Boys for employment as Temporary Boy Messengers in Government Departments will be kept by the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 2. The limits of age for registration will be 14 to 16, and Boy Messengers will not be retained as such after reaching the age of 20.
- 3. Boys may present themselves for examination, at such times as the Commissioners may fix, at the Civil Service Commission, Cannon Row, Westminster. They must be of good health and character, must satisfy the Commissioners of their ability to read and write,\* and must pay a fee of 1s.
- 4. Whenever the occasional service of Boy Messengers is required by a Department for any period, whether short or long, application will be made to the Civil Service Commissioners, who will select a boy from the list above mentioned. The insertion of a name on the Register will not, however, imply a certainty of employment; it will merely render a boy eligible for employment in case there should be a demand for his services.
- 5. The pay of Boy Messengers will be at the rate of 7s. 6d. per week, rising by 1s. 6d. per week for each year of approved service.
- \* Boys who can produce a certificate of having passed at least the Fifth Standard at some Public Elementary School will not be required to pass any Examination in Reading and Writing.

#### CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION,

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for situations as Male Learner in the Department of the Postmaster-General in Edinburgh, Dublin, and certain other Towns.

These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

- 1. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners-
  - (a) That their age on the day of the Examination is not less than 15 nor more than 18.
  - (b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.
- 2. At each Examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.
- 3. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:-
  - Handwriting.
  - 2. Orthography.
  - 3. English Composition, to be tested by a short essay or letter on a simple subject. Arithmetic, including Vulgar and Decimal
  - Fractions and Percentages.
  - 5. Geography (general).

Candidates who fail to obtain such an aggregate number of marks as may indicate in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners a competent amount of general proficiency will not be regarded as qualified.

- 4. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height, and no officer will be retained in the Service who does not attain the height of 5 feet 4 inches before completing his nineteenth year.
- 5. No Candidate will be admitted to Examination who does not, at such time as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, produce an undertaking, signed by his parent or guardian, that he will, if successful, reside within a suitable distance from the Post Office, either with his parents or guardians, or with relations or friends approved by such parents or guardians.
- 6. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service, Engineer Students in the Navy, and Apprentices in Her Majesty's Dockyards, will not be eligible unless they produce to the Civil Service Commissioners the written permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination, dated before the commencement of the Competition.
- 7. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 8. A fee of 4s. will be required from every Candidate attending the Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that Open Competitive Examinations for situations as Male Learner in Edinburgh, Dublin, Bath, Birmingham, Bradford (Yorks), Brighton, Bristol, Cardiff, Derby, Hull, Leeds, Leicester, Liverpool, Manchester, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Nor-wich, Nottingham, Plymouth, Portsmouth, Sheffield, Southampton, Swansea, York, Aberdeen, Dundee, Glasgow, Belfast, and Cork, in the Department of the Postmaster-General, will be held under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 14th February 1899.
