COAL MINES REGULATION ACT, 1896.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that, on the 23rd December 1898, he made an Order, under section 6 of "The Coal Mines Regulation Act, 1896," entitled the Explosives in Coal Mines Order of 23rd December 1898. This Order amends the Order of the 11th July 1898, by revoking so much of the Schedule of Permitted Explosives annexed to that Order as relates to the explosive known as Oxalate Blasting Powder, and by adding to the Schedule the following new explosives:—Argus Powder, Earthquake Powder, Elephant Brand Gunpowder No. 2, and Oxalate Blasting Powder (new definition).

The Order comes into force on the 1st January 1899.
