CITY AND ROYAL BURGH OF EDINBURGH.
RE-DIVISION OF CITY INTO WARDS.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Commissioners acting under section 11 of the Edinburgh Extension Act, 1896, have divided the City and Royal Burgh of Edinburgh into sixteen Wards, having the descriptions and boundaries and numbers and names hereinafter set forth, which Wards are delineated upon a map docketed and signed by the Commissioners, and deposited in the Office of the Town-Clerk, City Chambers, Edinburgh.

The descriptions, boundaries, numbers, and names of the new Wards are as follows:—

NO. I.—CALTON WARD.

That portion of the City and Royal Burgh comprehended within a line drawn from a point at the junction of Princes Street, Leith Street, and Waterloo Place north-eastwards, south-eastwards, eastwards, north-eastwards, and eastwards along the centre of Waterloo Place, Regent Road, Norton Place, and London Road to Railway Bridge at Abbeyhill Station, thence northwards and north-eastwards along the centre of the Leith Branches of the North British Railway to the Municipal Boundary, thence north-westwards along said Municipal Boundary to a point in the centre of Leith Walk at Pilrig, thence south-westwards along the centre of Leith Walk and Leith Street to the point first mentioned.

NO. II.—CANONGATE WARD.

That portion of the City and Royal Burgh comprehended within a line drawn from a point in the centre of Waterloo Place at Regent Arch, thence north-eastwards, south-eastwards, eastwards, north-eastwards, and eastwards along the centre of Waterloo Place, Regent Road, Norton Place, and London Road to Railway Bridge at Abbeyhill Station, thence northwards and north-eastwards along the centre of the Leith Branches of the North British Railway to the Municipal Boundary, thence south-eastwards, north-eastwards, south-eastwards, eastwards, south-eastwards, south-westwards, southwards, eastwards, southwards, south-westwards, south-eastwards, and south-westwards along the said Municipal Boundary to the St. Leonard's Branch of the North British Railway at Duddingston, thence north-westwards, westwards, north-westwards, and northwards along centre of said Railway and the Boundary of the Queen's Park to a point in the centre of Dumbiedykes Road at Arthur Street, thence north-eastwards, south-westwards, and north-westwards along the centre of Dumbiedykes Road, Waterston Avenue, St. John's Hill, Pleasance, St. Mary Street, Jeffrey Street, Jeffrey Street Foot Bridge, and Calton Road to the point first mentioned.

That portion of the City and Royal Burgh comprehended within a line drawn from a point at the junction of South Clerk Street, Newington Road, and East and West Preston Streets south-westwards, north-westwards, westwards, southwards, south-westwards, south-eastwards, eastwards, south-eastwards, and southwards along the centre of West Preston Street, Causewayside, Summerhall, Melville Drive, Argyle Place, Chalmers Crescent, Beaufort Road, Kilgraston Road, Grange Loan, and Blackford Avenue to the Municipal Boundary at Blackford, thence eastwards, south-eastwards, northwards, north-eastwards, south-eastwards, north-eastwards, south-eastwards, and north-eastwards along said Municipal Boundary to the St. Leonard's Branch of the North British Railway at Duddingston, thence north-westwards, westwards, and north-westwards along the centre of said Railway and the Boundary of the Queen's Park to Park Road, thence south-westwards, north-westwards, and south-westwards along the centre of Park Road, Dalkeith Road, and East Preston Street to the point first mentioned.
