PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Secretary for Scotland has, under the provisions of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, made a Representation stating that he has received a copy of an Interlocutor by the Sheriff-Substitute of the County of Lanark, finding that the Burial Ground, known as the Old Churchyard Burial Ground, at Abbey Green, in the Parish of Lesmahagow, is in a condition which is dangerous to health, and offensive and contrary to decency:

And whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that burials in the said Burying Ground should be discontinued, except for the burial of widows and widowers whose spouses have been buried therein, unless to such an extent as may upon application be specially authorised by the Parish Council of the Parish of Lesmahagow under such conditions and restrictions as may appear to the Council to be necessary in the public interest:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased to give notice of such Representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the 25th day of August 1900:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order, or notice thereof, be published in the Edinburgh Gazette, and that copies of this Order, or notice thereof, be affixed, as required by the above-mentioned Act, on the doors of the

Church of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before such Representation is so considered.
