

BURGH OF GOVAN

A PETITION has been presented in accordance with the provisions of the Burgh Police (Scotland) Act, 1892, and subsequent amending Acts, to the Sheriff of Lanarkshire by the Commissioners of the Burgh of Govan, craving his Lordship, after ordering publication by advertisement, and making such investigation as is directed by the said Act in such manner as he shall deem necessary, to revise and extend the boundaries of the said Burgh, and to mark out, define, and specify the revised and extended boundaries thereof, so as to include within the same the whole or portions of the following lands, viz.:—Blacklands, Braehed, Deanfield, Deanside, Drumoyne, Elderslie, Greenhead, Holmfauldhead, Lint-house, Merryflatts, Upper Merryflatts, Moss, Shieldhall, Shieldmuir, Shiels, Wester Shiels, and others; all lying within the Parish of Govan and County of Lanark, as shown and coloured red on a plan produced with the said Petition, and which lands, along with the lands presently forming the Burgh of Govan, are included in the proposed boundary as follows:—

A boundary commencing at a point in the centre line of the River Clyde where the same is joined or intersected by the centre line of the River Kelvin, and thence extending eastward along the centre line of the River Clyde, which is here the boundary of the City of Glasgow, to the point where the boundary of the said City strikes southward from the river near the General Terminus Railway Station, thence southward along the boundary of the City of Glasgow to the point where it is joined or intersected by the boundary of the Burgh of Kinning Park, thence westward and southward, again westward and again southward along the boundary of Kinning Park, to a point on the same where it cuts the original north side of the Glasgow and Paisley Joint Line of Railway, thence westward along the original north side of the said Railway to the point where it is intersected by the boundary of the Counties of Lanark and Renfrew, thence north-westward and westward along the said County boundary to the point where it is joined by the parliamentary boundary of Renfrew, thence northward along the said boundary until it intersects the boundary between the Counties of Lanark and Renfrew, thence northward, westward, and eastward, according to its changes of direction along the said County boundary until it cuts the centre line of the River Clyde at Marline Ford, and thence eastward along the centre line of the River Clyde to the point first herein mentioned as the beginning of the boundary.

On which Petition the Sheriff pronounced the following Deliverance, viz.:—

"Glasgow, 25th July 1900.—The Sheriff of the County of Lanark having considered the foregoing Petition, appoints the Petitioners (first) to publish by advertisement at least once in each of the Edinburgh Gazette, Glasgow Herald, and the Govan Press, a Notice containing the import of the said Petition with a description of the proposed new boundaries, and a copy of this Deliverance; (second) to serve a copy of said Petition and Deliverance on each of William Alston Dykes, as County Clerk of Lanarkshire; William H. Hill, Writer, Glasgow, as Clerk to the Lower Ward District Committee of the County of Lanark County Council; Andrew Wallace, 7 Carlton Place, Glasgow, as Clerk to the Govan Combination Parish Council; Sir James D. Marwick, as Town-Clerk, and on behalf of the Corporation of the City of Glasgow; and T. R. Mackenzie, as Secretary to the Trustees of the Clyde Navigation; and (third) by handbills posted and circulated through the Burgh of Govan and the area proposed to be annexed; and ordains all persons having interest, if they intend to show cause why the prayer of the Petition should not be granted, to lodge a Notice of Appearance in the hands of the Clerk of Court at Glasgow, within fourteen days from the date of the last of said advertisements; further, appoints parties or their Agents to meet within the Sheriff's Chambers, County Buildings, Wilson Street, Glasgow, upon Thursday the 6th day of September next, at 10.30 o'clock A.M., for the purpose of arranging procedure. In accordance with the said Deliverance, Intimation is hereby given of the import of the said Petition, with a description of the proposed new boundaries of the Burgh, and of the said Deliverance, and any party who may desire to oppose said extension, or to be heard in regard thereto, is hereby called upon to lodge a Notice of Appearance in the hands of the Clerk of Court at Glasgow, in accordance with the terms of the said Deliverance.
