LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACTS.

Alteration of Parish Areas.

PROPOSED ORDER No. XLVII.

DUNDEE COMBINATION PARISH (NEW PARISH OF LIFF AND BENVIE).

WHEREAS it has been represented to me by the County Council of the County of Forfar that I should issue an Order, under section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, and section 46 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1894, "detaching from Dundee Combination Parish the landward part of the Parish of Liff and Benvie, and creating the said landward part of the Parish of Liff and Benvie into a separate Parish, or such other or further Order as to the Secretary for Scotland shall seem necessary or expedient in order to provide a remedy in the circumstances:"

And whereas, after consulting with the authorities concerned, and causing a local inquiry to be held, I am of opinion that it is expedient to give effect to the said representation:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Alexander Hugh, Lord Balfour of Burleigh, Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do, in virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the Local Government (Scotland) Acts, order as follows:—

1. The portion of the former Parish of Liff, Benvie, and Invergowrie, now forming a landward part of Dundee Combination Parish, shall cease to be part of Dundee Combination Parish, and shall form a separate Parish, to be called the Parish of Liff and Benvie.

2. The Parish Council of Liff and Benvie shall assume responsibility for and shall relieve the Parish Council of Dundee Combination Parish of all advances which the latter body may be called upon to make for or on account of any pauper whose claim is derived (1) from birth in the said part of Dundee Combination Parish prior to the 3rd day of December 1901, or (2) from residence for the statutory period in the said part of Dundee Combination Parish prior to the 3rd day of December 1901.

3. Nothing herein contained shall affect the rights of Creditors or of persons having vested interests, and all questions of adjustment consequential on this Order are expressly reserved.

4. For the purpose of receiving the Parish Council Register prior to the election of a Parish Council and summoning the first statutory meeting of the Parish Council of Liff and Benvie, in terms of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1894, the Inspector of Poor of Dundee Combination Parish shall be deemed to be the Inspector of Poor of the Parish constituted by this Order.

5. This Order shall take effect on the 15th day of May 1901 for all purposes connected with the election of Parish Councils, and on the 3rd day of December 1901 for all other purposes.
