## FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of "The Rules Publication Act, 1893," notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of forty days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under section 1 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, exempting those parts of electric generating works and those frame dressing rooms of lace factories or lace warehouses in which the number of cubic feet of space bears to the number of persons employed therein at one time a proportion not less than 2500 to every person, from the provisions of the said section as to lime-washing.
